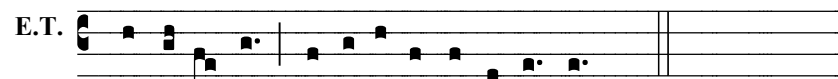

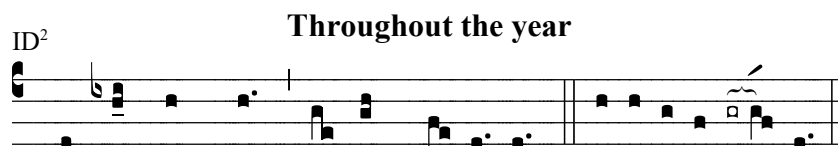

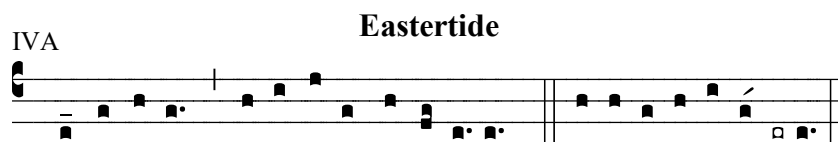

His heart is steady, he will not be afraid, \* until he sees his desire on his enemies.

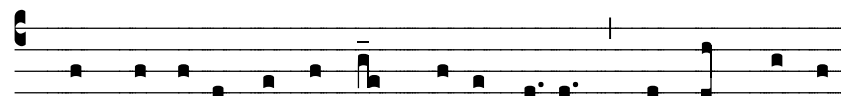

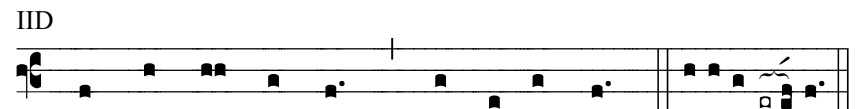
When Israel went forth from Egypt, the house of Jacob from a peoplê of strange language, \* Judah became his sanctuary, Israel his dominion.

The Lord swore to David a sure oath from which hé will nót turn back: \* "One of the sons of your body I will sét on yóur throne".


If your sons keep my covenant and my testimonies which Í shall téach them, \* their sons also for ever shall sít upón your throne."

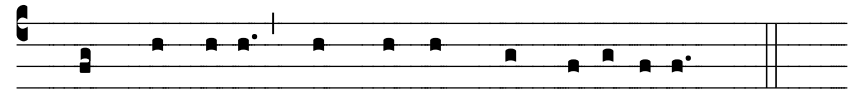


### Psalm 133

Behold how good and pleasant it is \* when brothers dwell in unity.

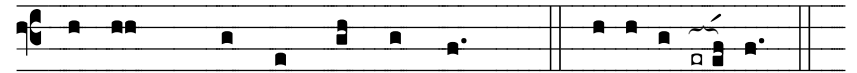
