



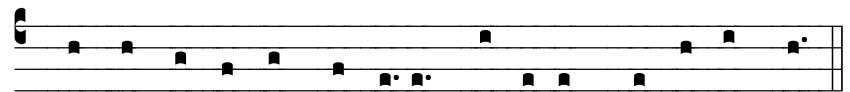

 God for all eternity.



When he calls to me, I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will rescue him and honour him. * With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.

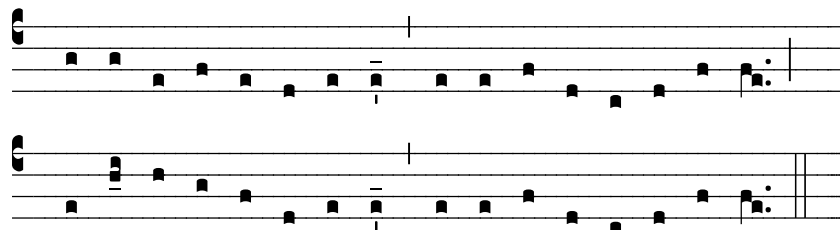
